Chief McGovern and Chief Storbeck,

Please be advised that road construction (milling and paving) is tentatively scheduled to begin on Wednesday, September 18th on Warwick Turnpike. There will be milling operations on 9/18, 9/19, and 9/20. Paving will be on 9/23, 9/24, and 9/25. The entire length of roadway for Vernon Township will be repaved, from the NY State Line to the West Milford Line. We have three police officers scheduled per day for the hours of 0630hrs-1700hrs for traffic control.

We will be deploying our message trailer later today or tomorrow to the area. We will also post on our township website to alert residents. I would anticipate that there will be some temporary "Road Construction Ahead" signs placed in Warwick and West Milford depending on the section of roadway they are working at in Vernon.

Dear Public Official:

Orange and Rockland Utilities, Inc. is at the height of its smart meter deployment in Orange and Sullivan counties. Therefore, it is an appropriate time to update you on the installation progress and review our customer communications efforts during deployment. To date, we have installed approximately 41,000 electric smart meters in Orange and Sullivan counties. This is out of a total population of 113,000. In addition, we have installed roughly 19,000 smart gas modules. This is out of a total population of 42,500.

Our deployment plans follow predesigned meter reading billing groups and routes. A single town, village, or city will never be saturated all at once. Deployment is expected to conclude in the summer of 2020.

Customers will be notified of their smart meter installation 90 days prior, with a postcard sent through direct mail. In succession, a more detailed letter is sent 45 days in advance, this letter explains the process of installation, highlights FAQs, and gives customers the opportunity to make an appointment. Lastly, an automated phone call is generated 10-14 days before installation. This serves as the final reminder before customer contact is attempted on the day of installation. A door hanger will be left on all premises after the work is complete.

Smart meters will allow our customers to proactively keep track of their energy use and help manage their bill. Other benefits include:

- We will know when power goes out which will help with faster restoration;
- No more estimated bills;
- No more waiting at home for a meter reading, remote activation; and
- The ability to make wiser energy decisions that benefit the environment.



**FIRST AMENDMENT
TO THE
LICENSE AGREEMENT**

This First Amendment (the "**Amendment**") to the Agreement (as defined below) by and between the Town of Warwick, a municipal corporation maintaining an office at 132 Kings Highway, Warwick, NY 10990 (the "**Town**"), and Citiva Medical LLC, a New York limited liability company with a business address at 420 Lexington Avenue, Suite 414, New York, NY 10170 ("**Citiva**"), is effective as of August 20, 2019. Capitalized terms used herein but not otherwise defined shall have the meanings ascribed to them in the Agreement.

WHEREAS, the Town and Citiva (collectively, the "**Parties**") entered into that certain License Agreement dated as of December 5, 2017 (the "**Agreement**") for the license of the Licensed Property for a term ending on January 1, 2019;

WHEREAS, Citiva elected in accordance with Section 2 of the Agreement and the Town agreed to extend the term of the of the License until December 31, 2019; and

WHEREAS, the Parties desire to further extend the term of the License.

NOW THEREFORE, for good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the Parties hereto agree as follows:

1. **License Term.** The first sentence of Section 2 of the Agreement shall be deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following:

"The license granted herein shall terminate on December 31, 2020, and at the end or other expiration of the term, Citiva shall deliver up the Licensed Premises in at least as good order and condition as when received, wear and tear and event of casualty or condemnation excepted."

2. **Miscellaneous.** Except as otherwise expressly provided in this Amendment, the terms and conditions of the Agreement shall remain unchanged and in full force and effect. This Amendment may be executed in counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, and all of which when affixed together shall constitute but one and the same instrument. TOWN OF WARWICK TOWN BOARD
FINDINGS PURSUANT TO THE "MONROE BALANCING OF PUBLIC INTEREST TEST"

315 GLENMERE AVENUE

WHEREAS, the Village of Florida ("Village") is a municipal corporation duly organized under the laws of the State of New York, with all powers granted thereunder; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Warwick ("Town") is a municipal corporation duly organized under the laws of the State of New York, with all powers granted thereunder; and

WHEREAS, the Village owns property in the Town located at 315 Glenmere Avenue (the "Premises"), in the Conservation (CO) zoning district and identified on the tax map as Section 9, Block 1, Lot 6.1; and

WHEREAS, the Premises is currently used as the Village's water treatment plant;

WHEREAS, the water treatment plant needs to be upgraded to comply with State and Federal water quality regulations;

WHEREAS, GHD Consulting Services, Inc and Fusco Engineering have prepared a Water Treatment Plant Process Evaluation dated August 2019 setting forth the recommended repairs and upgrades;

WHEREAS, the Village of Florida Village Board declared its intent to be lead agency pursuant to the State Environmental Quality Review Act ("SEQR") on August 7, 2019 and has distributed notice of such declaration to all interest or involved agencies;

WHEREAS, the Court of Appeals in *In the Matter of the County of Monroe*, 72 NY2d 338 (1988) established a "balancing of the public interest" test in determining whether a municipality was subject to another municipality's zoning law; and

WHEREAS, although the Court of Appeals did not identify which municipal entity should conduct the balancing test, the Town hereby determines that as the host community responsible for the enforcement of its zoning law, it has the authority and the right to conduct the *Monroe* balancing test and enforce its findings; and

WHEREAS, the Town hereby weighs the nine (9) factors set forth in *Monroe*: 1) the nature and scope of the instrumentality seeking immunity; 2) the encroaching government's legislative grant of authority; 3) the kind of function or land use involved; 4) the effect local land use regulation would have upon the enterprise concerned; 5) alternative locations for the facility in less restrictive zoning areas; 6. the impact upon legitimate local interests; 7) alternative methods of providing the proposed improvement; 8) the extent of the public interest to be served by the improvements; and 9) intergovernmental participation in the project development process and an opportunity to be heard.

1. The nature and scope of the instrumentality seeking immunity. The Village is the "instrumentality" seeking immunity from the Town zoning law.

2. The encroaching government's legislative grant of authority. The Village is a municipality within and adjoining the Town duly organized under the laws of the State of New York, with all of the power and authority vested in it by the State Legislature and by the New York State

Constitution. Such grant of power, however, does not extend to regulation of land contained within the Town, which is solely vested in the Town Board.

3. The kind of function or land use involved. The Village seeks immunity from the Town zoning law so that it may upgrade its water treatment plant to provide potable water to Village residents and other users including the Valley View Center, Hearthstone and Orange County Correctional Facility.

4. The effect local land use regulation would have upon the enterprise concerned. The use of a building, structure, lot or land or part thereof which is not listed as a permitted use, special permit use or accessory use is prohibited. Town of Warwick Zoning Code. In this case, Town of Warwick uses and buildings are permitted but not uses and buildings belonging to other municipalities.

5. Alternative locations for the facility in less restrictive zoning areas. There is no "alternative" location in the Village, as this is an existing structure. Relocating the water treatment plant would be cost prohibitive and impractical.

6. The impact upon legitimate local interests. The Town recognizes that water treatment, is a crucial function that should not be constrained by zoning issues. By granting immunity to the Village, the Town significantly reduces planning and zoning costs which will be borne by residents of both the Town and the Village as Village residents are also Town residents.

7. Alternative methods of providing the proposed improvement. There are no other alternatives.

8. The extent of the public interest to be served by the improvements. As noted, water treatment is an essential government function which benefits the Town, the Village and the County.

9. Intergovernmental participation in the project development process and an opportunity to be heard. The Town will have all rights afforded under law to participate in the State Environmental Quality Review process as well as the intergovernmental planning process provided for by General Municipal Law § 239 et seq.' This waiver of zoning will be considered at a regular meeting of the Town Board upon to the public.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT REOLVED, the foregoing "WHEREAS" clauses are incorporated into and made an integral part of this Determination and Resolution;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Premises have been used as a water treatment plant and the Town wishes to ensure that such use continues; and that the Town Board finds that the effect of granting immunity from its zoning law to allow the prohibited use to continue would be minimal as set forth in the Monroe balancing test herein;

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees finds that there shall be no impacts on legitimate local interests of any kind and will have no real or practical effect on the community, the environment or other factors.

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED that the Town Board hereby finds that the Monroe balancing test conducted herein favors the continued use of the Premises as a water treatment plant and for the necessary upgrades. Therefore, the Town waives its zoning law for that purpose and that purpose only and determines that the Village of Florida may continue to use the Premises located at 315 Glenmere Avenue identified on the Town of Warwick tax map as Section 9-Block 1- Lot 6.1, for water treatment together with the necessary upgrades.

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED that the Town Board hereby consents to the Village Board serving as Lead Agency for purposes of SEQR.

This 5G technology will cause me to be exposed to wireless non-ionizing electromagnetic radiation against my consent and in my home.

Contamination of my home with 5G may cause damage to my home if it becomes a health risk to me and thus render my home uninhabitable. Irradiating me with wireless non-ionizing electromagnetic radiation against my consent would be an application of force against my person and which causes fear of bodily injury and could be classed as a civil trespass and/or a criminal assault.

Any level of exposure of man-made non-ionizing electromagnetic radiation can be diagnosed by my medical practitioner as an adverse health effect pursuant to the WHO's International Classification of Diseases ICD-10, code W90 thus rendering any safety limit as set by the government safety standards obsolete as to protecting my health. As needed, I may see my doctor for advice on the 5G issue.

If 5G technology is deployed within your constituency, I expect that you as my elected representative will exercise due diligence to certify that all parties deploying 5G technologies have sufficient insurance cover to compensate for damage or harm caused by the emission of wireless non-ionizing electromagnetic radiation. Please note that this could be a problem, since underwriters such as Lloyds of London do not insure for such harm and damage.

I urge you, as my elected official, to act in the public interest by addressing the potential cumulative harms of densification (the crowding of small cells into a limited area to enable 5G) and insisting that public safety regulatory authorities need to prove that such densification of 5G technology is safe and that any deployment of 5G, Artificial Intelligence (AI), and/or the Internet of Things (IoT), is regulated appropriately to ensure that the national security and the safety and privacy of the public and myself is not compromised.

I am genuinely concerned for your welfare, the general public and mine, and this is a situation of the utmost urgency. I have studied the relevant facts and am thus aware of the danger. As a result I am in fear and I take the risk of harm and damage to me very seriously.

To help bring you up to speed on this extremely important topic, please go to the5Gsummit.com, and listen for free to what 40 highly regarded experts inclusive of scientists, medical practitioners and lawyers from around the world have to say on the 5G subject. Experts who are not censored by the telecommunications industry, nor their captured governments, nor the captured media. Further, to assist with your education, please look at the Bio-initiative Report 2012 (updated 2017) - A Rationale for Biologically-based Public Exposure Standards for Electromagnetic Fields (ELF and RF) bioinitiative.org and Physicians for Safe Technology – 5G Mobile Communications mdsafe.org.

I implore you as my civic leader, and as my elected representative to get educated on this important topic, and show me by your decisions, actions and omissions that you are taking precautionary steps to address the risk of harm to me and all the people within your constituency.

How will a smart meter help me?

Your smart meter will let you keep track of how you are using energy and help you manage your bill.

Once your smart meter is installed, you'll have online access to detailed information about your daily energy use. You can use that information to make choices that can help you save energy and money.

- See your energy usage in 15-minute increments.
- Get high-bill alerts (and tips on how to avoid them).
- Get information about energy-saving products and services.

Smart meters will allow us to read your meter remotely. That means no more waiting for a meter reader, and no more estimated bills. We will also be able to activate service remotely.

If you use solar energy, a smart meter will help us integrate these renewable resources more efficiently.

When will I get my new meter?

Installation will begin in Rockland County during the summer of 2017. O&R plans to install smart meters throughout its entire service territory by 2020. O&R will notify you with a postcard and a letter before installation starts in your area. If you need to be home for us to access your meter, we'll let you know how to set up an appointment. Installation takes only about 15 minutes.

Will my power be interrupted while you install my new meter?

Yes, there will be a brief pause in your electric service (a couple of minutes at most). For many commercial customers, we may be able to avoid a service interruption. We will leave you a reminder to reset your clocks and other appliances, and we apologize for this inconvenience.

Will I need to do anything to start my meter?

Nope, we'll handle everything for you. But we'll be providing you with instructions on how to access and make the best use of information from your smart meter.

How are you protecting my privacy?

We take cyber security seriously, so all information is transmitted through an encrypted network. No personal information is captured or transmitted by the smart meter, and all your energy usage information is kept confidential by O&R and our vendors.

Do I still need to call O&R to report an outage?

Yes. Smart meters will alert us about most outages in your neighborhood. But we suggest you continue to tell us about any problems you are having so that we can address them as quickly as possible.

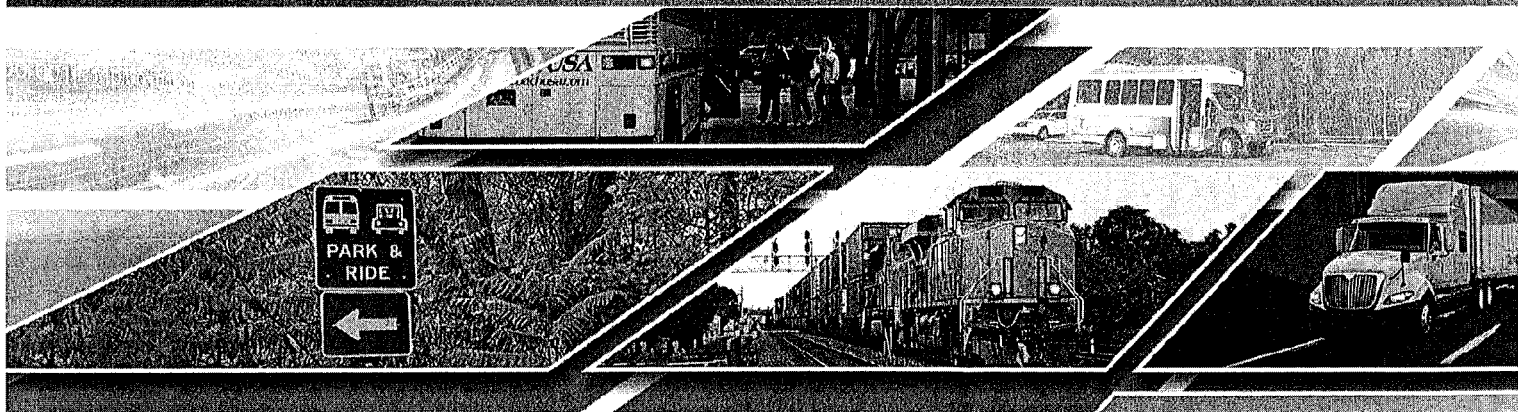

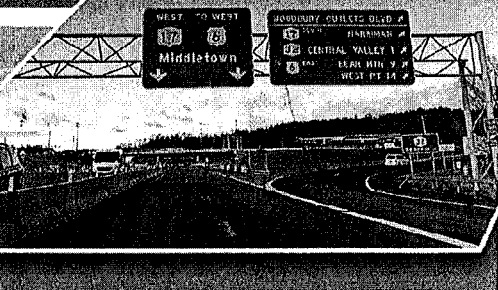
