COUNCILMAN DE ANGELO REPORT

1. The Post Report for November 2020 is as follows: Greenwood Lake had 122 calls, the Town outside the Village had 499 calls, Pine Island had 288 calls, the Village of Warwick had 386 calls and the Greenwood Lake Fire District had 44 calls for a total of 1,339 for the month of November.

2. The Post Report for December 2020 is as follows: Greenwood Lake had 103 calls, the Town outside the Village had 531 calls, Pine Island had 243 calls, the Village of Warwick had 369 calls and the Greenwood Lake Fire District had 67 calls for a total of 1,313 for the month of December.

Police Chief McGovern – We don't dispatch for the Greenwood Lake Fire District. Those calls are actually calls in the Village of Greenwood Lake that we do dispatch to the ambulance or other situations.

3. The Warwick Valley Humane Society temporarily closed the shelter to the public due to one of the staff testing positive to COVID. Animal Control is still available to pick up stray dogs and to respond to any and all animal emergencies. They placed all adoptions on hold, however they are asking potential adopters to please complete our application which can be downloaded from our website at wvhumane.org. The completed application can be returned by email or faxed to 845-987-8995. Once processed they will be in contact to set up an appointment as soon as they reopen.

4. They want to thank the Town of Warwick for renewing the low cost spay/neuter program for cats. The \$25 T.A.R.A. Certificates are available by appointment only and again with stricter protocols in place. A proof of residency is required and be purchased with exact cash only.

5. The Warwick Valley Humane Societies current residents for adoption are 5 dogs 59 adult cats, 13 kittens, 2 rabbits and they also had a few rescues.

SUPERVISORS REPORT

1. The Community Preservation Fund receipts for December 2020 were \$141,358.71. The mortgage report from the State also tracks that there was a brisk yearend sale of transfers of property. That helps the fund, that's great.

2. Speed limit change at a request of a resident from Horse Hill Lane on Route 17A/94, he requested that the Town and the State consider reducing the speed limit to 45. Extending it from where it changes outside of the village to Horse Hill Lane and it ends now around Flowick. The State did an analysis and looked at far sighting, they looked at signage and did put additional signage up but they declined to reduce the speed limit. As we have said many times the towns cannot control their own speed limits, they are set by the State of New York. I just want to let residents know that.

3. This Monday is the remembrance of Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. and the Town Hall will be closed. There will be a zoom service at the UAME Church and I'm sad that we can't do that in person because it's always an uplifting service. I think that the

times that were in the lessons of Dr. King are more important than ever and hopefully people take some time on that day to perhaps read something from Dr. King and take it to heart.

4. I did receive a letter late today from Orange and Rockland Utilities informing us that they are going to be doing vegetation management on Long Meadow Road, which is in the far reaches of town near Tuxedo. For informational purposes if you see them out there.

WHEREAS, this legislation extends to the 2021 assessment roll the renewal of exemptions received on the 2020 assessment roll pursuant to sections 467 and 459-c of the Real Property Tax Law without the necessity of an application by the eligible recipient, and

WHEREAS, this legislation permits a local law or resolution allowing the Assessor to require a renewal application to be filed in certain circumstances.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Town Board of the Town of Warwick that the Assessor may in her discretion require a renewal application if she believes that a property owner that qualified for the exemption on the 2020 assessment roll has since changed their primary residence, added another owner to the deed, transferred the property to a new owner, or died, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that eligible recipients of such renewal application shall not be required to appear in person to file such application.

PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR (GENERAL)

Raphael Santiago – Resident, Town of Warwick – I'm not too familiar how things work with the Planning Board, I do have their number to call but I notice there's a great deal of activity on the road last year of measurements for water and electrical for a subdivision my neighbor is requesting. I don't know if an impact study has been made of the area, if we had any turtles or various other things.

Supervisor Sweeton – That will all done if there's a subdivision, the Chairman of the Planning Board is actually behind you. If there is a subdivision before the Planning Board all of those issues get investigated during that process. You can come into the Town Hall, now we are limited because we are only open in the lobby but we can arrange to bring a map out for you to look at and then you can follow that process they will have public hearings and there will be time for public comments on it. All of the issues like traffic and environmental issues all get reviewed by the Planning Board before any approvals are done anything can be done.

Raphael Santiago – I don't know how quickly the COVID 19 vaccine will be available?

Supervisor Sweeton – I was on a call today the County Executive with the other Supervisors and Mayors and the issue is clearly the supply of the vaccine. The State is just not getting enough and we are not getting enough from the State, so it's a chaotic process, but the State is driving it. All we can do is encourage residents to do if you fall into that 1B category 65 and older or one of the categories of workers just continue to try and get yourself an appointment either through the website or the phone. It's a painful process because it can take literally hours before you get through, but we are encouraging you to do that. If supplies suddenly increase it'll be easier but it will be false hope to say that there's going to be a bigger supply in the near term. I wish I had better news for you.

Raphael Santiago – I know we already have a large area to cover in Warwick that I know of as far as the PD is concerned with recent retirements and appointments. I'm kind of concerned with this new government mandate towards the PD and what the restructure of that and how that will affect our community and the ability to adequately address the constituents of Warwick? It's like a catch 22 in a sense of work, you're damned if you do and damned if you don't and I'm to the point to side with caution like having a social worker coming into a really bad situation.



But going forward the Chief and I are going to put forward a plan which will be put on our website and you can look at it and then there will be an opportunity for public comment for that plan. We have an exceptional department and I think they do a great job with the resources they have. This is a big challenging town with a lot of area and our pledge to you is if we can improve the department we will, but certainly are not going to hinder the department in their ability to keep us safe. Stay tuned to that process and that hearing will probably happen sometime in February is my guess and I would love to have your comments at that time.

Raphael Santiago – My best to all.

Supervisor Sweeton – If you have any questions on the planning process again you can call my office or the planning office and we'll make arrangements for you to see the maps.
