COUNCILMAN DE ANGELO REPORT

1. The Post Report for June 2021 is as follows: Greenwood Lake had 155 calls, the Town outside the Village had 497 calls, Pine Island had 211 calls, the Village of Warwick had 386 calls and the Greenwood Lake Volunteer Ambulance District had 56 calls for a total of 1,305 for the month of June.

Police Chief McGovern – I want to make a comment regarding a press release that was forwarded to the local papers. Arrests were made yesterday by Warwick’s Detectives, Narcotic Officers along with New York City Police, Attorney Generals, Detectives and the New York City and New Jersey Water Front Commission. An investigation that ran for about 20 months and no one on the Board knew about it except for the Supervisor. Our

Officers were out two to three hundred hours on wiretaps, doing surveillance in the city in the Boroughs of Manhattan, Staten Island and Brooklyn with Detectives from the Attorney General's Office. I just want to say this whole case which has morphed into entrusting interstate and federal in nature and you will see in the amounts of money and the amounts of pills and cocaine that was seized from these traffickers. I just want to say the whole thing started in Warwick on a traffic stop and a lot of language coming out of Albany and locally lately has been aimed at the police. One of the biggest of those is traffic stops, pretext traffic stops, well let me just tell you there's no such thing as a pretext traffic stop. Bad guys drive around in cars committing crimes and that's how we got them. Kudos to my Police Officers and my Detectives for the cooperation between this department, the State, the Attorney General's Office, New York City Police Department, all of whom took part in this investigation. What can I tell you, if you want results, you want public safety be proactive, you want window dressing be progressive.

Supervisor Sweeton – Again, for the public's information the men and woman in the department they are diligent and they do their job day in and day out. They enforce the law and that's exactly what they do. This is just a great example how doing their routine duty led to a takedown on some really bad people and took a lot of illicit drugs off the street that potentially could kill people. Kudos to the department, to our officers involved in the initial traffic stop as well as our investigative group of officers as well. I know this Board is proud of the Warwick Police Department and the job you do and I think the community is as a whole. Thank you very much Chief.

Police Chief McGovern – Thank you.

2. The Warwick Valley Humane Society Shelter will reopen to visitors and adoptions between 12 and 4 daily by appointment only to limit the number of people in the building at one time. They are seeking volunteers to help them clean and feed the cats in the mornings and walk some of their dogs in the afternoon. If you are interested, please call ahead to set up a day and time at 845-986-2473.

3. The Warwick Valley Humane Society is hiring, if you are interested in helping the animals at the shelter with cleaning, feeding, medicating, socializing and helping the public, please call 845-986-2473 to set up an interview. The positions available are full and part time.

4. Suzyn Barron asked me to bring attention to our Seniors if you are in need of help caring for your pet, please call the Warwick Humane Society. They can provide food, transportation to and from grooming or vet appointments and help with other concerns. Reminder to please make special arrangements with family, friends or the shelter should an emergency arise.

5. Currently they have 12 dogs, 29 adult cats, 49 kittens, 7 rabbits and 1 guinea pig and they are all looking for a forever home.

6. The Town of Warwick Friendly Visitor Program for the month of June the number of neighbors helped were 50, the number of volunteers were 32, the total number of services provided by volunteers were 511, the total volunteers hours were 307. If you are in need of this kind of help you can call the Friendly Visitor Program at 986-1124 ext. 400.

Supervisor Sweeton – You have to leave your name, number, the time you called and someone will get back to you. Again, it's a free service to seniors in our community and if you know of one who could use help with going to the store, doctors, shop for them, visit them or check on them. The intent is to keep them in their home and it's a free service and we thank the Friendly Visitor Volunteers.

COUNCILMAN KOWAL REPORT

1. As I reported last month, we were planning to open up the pools at the Kutz Camp and the inspection by the Orange County Department of Health. The County did their inspection and found that one of the pools pump systems did not have the correct capacity for public pools. A pool pump has to be the capacity that exchanges the water every 6 hours. They calculated that one of the pumps was not the right size, so they did not clear us to have anybody swim in that pool, so instead of just having one pool open we are going to keep both of them closed for now because it doesn't make any sense logistically to have one pool operating and as soon as we get the new pump installed and it meets the county criteria, we will open it up. Hopefully we have the right number of lifeguards to help it be operatable. As soon as we get the hardware, we will be good to go with having a pool. It's kind of a new thing for us, like an owner of a new piece of equipment you find things here and there and not knowing that one pump was an insufficient size, kind of blindsided us, so we are going to be a little delayed but hopefully we will get it open for some portion of the summer.

Supervisor Sweeton – Apparently it was designed properly but must have been changed out at some point.

SUPERVISORS REPORT

1. The Community Preservation Fund Receipts for June 2021 were \$166,883.66, so again, a pretty good receipt for the month which brings the total balance in the fund to \$4,940,357.95, again a good month for the fund.

2. I want to remind residents that on July 24th the County will be hosting its Household Hazardous Waste Collection Day from 9:00 a.m. until 3:00 p.m. that is a Saturday and it is at the Thomas Bull Memorial Park, 90 Grove Street in Campbell Hall its by the picnic area, it's off of Route 416. It's free to Orange County residents, you can dispose of all of those things that you don't know what to do with that you have in a closet or down in the basement the oil-based paints, stains, varnishes, wood preservatives, cleaners, pool chemicals, pesticides, fluorescent bulbs, aerosol cans and all of those things. You have to put them in the back of your car, you drive up, show them your proof of

residency and they will take it out of your car and they will dispose of it properly. It's really a great service and we should do it. That's July 24th from 9:00 a.m. until 3:00 p.m. at Thomas Bull Memorial Park.

3. The Repair Café is going to be reinstated this year and it's this Saturday, July 17th from 10:00 a.m. until 2:00 p.m. right behind us in the Senior Center. We're anxious to have that back and that's where you can bring things mechanical, electrical, appliances, laptops, cellphones, lights, jewelry, wooden things, clothing, textiles, soft toys and they also sharpen tools and knives. Masks will be worn by all of the volunteers and guests while inside the Senior Center, so be aware of that. It's a great service, the volunteers are there and you can make a donation and get that stuff fixed that you have laying around.

4. The ARA Funds, those are the American Recovery Act Funds part of that huge package that was passed by the Federal Government in March allocated money to go directly to municipalities. As they generally do on the higher levels of government, there were some caveats, one was that the money going to municipalities of less than 50,000 people had to go through the State of New York which delayed it, but it's coming. We did receive a notification that we would be receiving \$18,940,822.00 half this year and half next year and it can only be spent on a specific number of things. Primarily for us it will be water and sewer district improvements and we have 7 water districts and 2 sewer districts, so we will put it to good use. We look forward to getting it, we don't have it yet, we assume we will be getting it fairly soon.

5. Journal entries were made with the Comptroller, everything was in order and I did sign off on that.

6. Just a note that Orange and Rockland will be out doing vegetation management around town, it's Nelson Tree Service it will be their trucks and they will be doing tree trimming around powerlines to prevent what invariably happens in the winter where a tree can take down a powerline and put you out of service for quite some time. Be aware they're in the area working.

7. Supervisors Corner is published each week in the Warwick Dispatch and I just want to say about the Dispatch they had run into some financial issues, they had some staff leave and two gentlemen have stepped in to take it over. They professed that they want to continue it in a hometown style that it was and in fact improve it to keep a timely avenue for local news. Time will tell, they've published a couple of issues already which look pretty decent, so I think it behooves us all to keep it the Dispatch going if we can and I encourage us to stay involved in that.

Motion Supervisor Sweeton, seconded Councilman DeAngelo to adopt the following resolution:

WHEREAS, The Town of Warwick (the "Town") is a "franchising authority" in accordance with Title VI of the Communications Act of 1934, (the "Communications Act"), and is authorized to grant one or more nonexclusive cable television franchises pursuant to Article 11 of the New York Public Service Law, as amended, and Title 16, Chapter VIII, Parts 890.60 through 899, of the Official Compilation of Codes, Rules and Regulations of the State of New York, as amended (collectively the "Cable Laws");

WHEREAS, the Town executed a franchise renewal agreement with Cablevision of Warwick, LLC, ("Franchisee") on June 18, 2010, which was thereafter confirmed and made effective by the New York State Public Service Commission ("Commission") on October 20, 2010 for a term of ten (10) years (Case No. 10-V-0306); and

WHEREAS said franchise renewal agreement thereafter expired on October 20, 2020, and

WHEREAS, Franchisee has submitted a proposed Franchise Renewal Agreement to continue operating a cable system within the Town; and

WHEREAS, The Town and Franchisee have mutually agreed to the terms of the Franchise Renewal Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the Town has determined that Franchisee has the requisite legal, technical and financial capabilities to operate a cable system within the Town and that Franchisee's proposals for renewal of the franchise meets the cable related needs of the community; and

WHEREAS, a duly noticed Public Hearing, affording an opportunity for all those interested parties within the Town to be heard on the proposed Franchise Renewal Agreement was held before the Town on June 24, 2021.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it

RESOLVED, that the Town Board determines that it is in the best interest of the public to award a Franchise Renewal Agreement to the Franchisee; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED that the Town Board hereby authorizes the Supervisor to enter into a Franchise Renewal Agreement with Cablevision of Warwick, LLC, and to

execute any other documents necessary to effectuate the granting of the Franchise renewal Agreement on behalf of the Town of Warwick


John Reilly – It wasn't an issue before I've been living here for 15 years.
